Dominique Moisi is a leading European geographical strategy thinker. A famous international science research institute (IFRI) is a famous political scientist, author, and co-founder.

He is a member of the European Council on Foreign Affairs, the International Council on Political Science of the Moscow Political Academy, and a special member of the Bilderberg Group. Moisi is currently a professor at Sciences Po in Paris, and a Pierre Keller guest professor at Harvard University. He is also the director of the European Geopolitics Commission at the University of Warsaw, and a guest professor at King's College London.

In the 1990s, Moisi, along with Timothy Garton Ash and Michael Mertes, co-authored the 'Three Countries' (UK-Germany-France) paper.

He is a specialist in international relations and geopolitics, and is highly respected in the field. He has written frequently on the future of Europe, the geopolitical trend, and the geopolitics of emotions.

Moisi is a frequent contributor to the Financial Times, New York Times, Die Welt, Der Standard, Foreign Affairs, and other major newspapers. He is the author of the book 'The Geopolitics of Emotions: Fear, Humiliation, and the Culture of Hope' (2009), which has been translated into 20 languages.
